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






THE HISTORY OF TAMPA CITY BALLET

Tampa City Ballet began its evolution seventeen years ago when Paula Nuñez founded America's Ballet School in 2002. After ten years of educating and training dancers, Nuñez wanted to broaden the dance school's community service. In 2012, she founded Tampa City Ballet as a non-profit organization. The original mission of Tampa City Ballet was to fund the outreach program "On Your Feet".

The program began on a small scale with Nuñez and Ballet Master Osmany Montano teaching dance to students at local schools and encouraging talented students to continue their training at America's Ballet School through scholarships provided by the "On your Feet" program. Many of the students who began their training with "On Your Feet" have gone on to be awarded scholarships at prestigious institutions and join professional dance companies.

Some of "On Your Feet's" success stories are:

Anderson Da Silva, an Ybor City native, who began his training with us at 10 years of age, has been awarded a full scholarship to Indiana University, where he is studying for a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance. Anderson continues to excel in this program, earning top marks in all of his courses, and will graduate in 2020.

Adia Hollist, another Ybor City native, has used her training with us to earn a full scholarship to the Boston Conservatory, where she is studying for a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance as well. Adia is set to graduate in 2021.

Stephanie Carpio and her brother Brandon were both "On Your Feet" scholarship recipients. Stephanie went on to study at New York University and is currently dancing with OperGraz in Austria, where she recently performed the lead role of Juliet in Prokofiev's ballet. Brandon attended the University of Southern California and recently graduated from the prestigious Glorya Kauffman School of Dance.

Kate-Lynn Robichaux-Thornton, another long-term student of the "On Your Feet" scholarship program, is currently a principal dancer with the Orlando Ballet.

Tampa City Ballet and the "On Your Feet" scholarship program is very proud of our talented dancers and alumni, knowing we have made a positive difference in so many lives.

In 2018, Tampa City Ballet became a professional contemporary dance company. In May 2018, committed to a 21st Century dance repertoire, Tampa City Ballet debuted with the performance of "AfterImage". We were thrilled to be joined by eight of our "On Your Feet" alumni for this inaugural performance.

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Luana Hidalgo, Outreach Director & Ballet Mistress

Luana Hidalgo started studying dance at the Institute of Art at an early age and graduated from Madame Irene Levandoski's Ballet School. She became a soloist with Ballet of Maracaibo before she became a principal dancer for Ballet Nuevo Mundo de Caracas, continuing on to become a principal dancer with The Cleveland -San Jose Ballet. In 1995, she was awarded "Best Classical Dancer - Casa del Artista" in Venezuela and in 2001 received the honor of the "City of Avignon" in France. Hidalgo has been a dance teacher for the Cleveland San Jose Ballet School, The Nevada Ballet Theatre, Ballet San Jose and Vladimir Issaev School of Classical Ballet. Upon her move to Tampa in 2017, Hidalgo joined the America's Ballet School faculty and Paula Nunez's outreach project "On Your Feet" with Tampa City Ballet.

Paul Lewis, Music Composer for Tampa City Ballet

Paul Eddison Lewis has composed a variety of works ranging from electronic music to pieces for large ensemble. In 2014, Lewis' work, The Ninth Gate, was honored with the BMI Student Composer Award. Lewis' involvement in electro-acoustic has resulted in several works for fixed media and works for live instrument and electronics.

In addition to his compositional achievements, Lewis is also an active music performer with experience playing contrabass with the USF Symphony Orchestra under the direction of William Wiedrich and the Mostly Pops Orchestra under the direction of Robert Romanski.

Paul composed and arranged the music for Tampa City Ballet's "7th Ave & Ybor."

Soledad Sanchez Valdes, Visual Arts Director

Soledad is an interdisciplinary artist from Lima, Peru. She holds a BFA in Visual Arts with a minor in Sculpture from Pontificia Universidad Catolica del Peru, and an MFA in Scenic Design from Penn State University. Her visual arts production includes works in metal, wood, fiberglass, ceramics, and mixed media. She is a member of OISTAT Performance Design Space commission and USITT. Soledad Sanchez Valdez is currently a visiting Professor of Design at USF School of Theatre and Design.

ARTISTIC TEAM

Paula Nunez, Founder & Artistic Director

Paula Nunez is a former professional Principal ballet dancer, choreographer, and current Faculty member at the University of South Florida. Nunez trained at the Gustavo Franklin School in Caracas, Venezuela and her professional career began at the International Ballet of Caracas. She subsequently went on to become a celebrated Principal dancer with the Ballet Nuevo Mundo de Caracas and Cleveland-San José Ballet. 19 years ago she founded internationally renowned America's Ballet School, where she serves the community by providing world-class ballet training. She has won "Best Choreographer" and "Best School" awards at multiple, prestigious dance competition venues, and enjoys working with others as a guest choreographer. Nunez is thrilled to continue contributing to Tampa's cultural life as the founder and Artistic Director of Tampa City Ballet and its outreach programs.

Elsa Valbuena, Resident Choreographer

Elsa Valbuena is one of Colombia's Contemporary Dance pioneers. She studied Music and Visual Arts before dedicating her life to Contemporary Dance. In 1982 Elsa founded Gaudere Danza in Cali, Colombia. Moving to the city of Bogota in 1986, she began an interesting exchange between the classically trained dancer and the contemporary language of dance and soon became the assistant to the artistic director /resident choreographer to the Compania Colombiana de Ballet until 1992. Since her arrival in 1993 to the Tampa Bay area, she has established herself as a dancer, choreographer and teacher. She co-founded Moving Current, a choreographer's collective in 1997 and served as co-artistic director for the following four years in Tampa.

Osmany Montano, Associate Artistic Director & Ballet Master

Osmany Montano trained at the Escuela Nacional de Ballet in La Habana, Cuba, under the direction of Alicia Alonso, Ramona De Saa, and Magda Campo. In Cuba, Montano danced with the Cuban National Ballet and Ballet of Santiago de Cuba, under the direction of Alicia Alonso and Maria Elena Martinez respectively, as well as Ballet of Camaguey under the direction of Fernando Alonso. He also had a distinguished career with the National Ballet of Caracas under the direction of Vicente Nebrada. In the United States, he performed with the Tulsa Ballet and Sarasota Ballet. Since 2007, he joined the faculty of America's Ballet School, and since 2011, he has been an Adjunct Dance Professor at the University of South Florida and since 2017, Associate Artistic Director of Tampa City Ballet.
